BBP LIBRARY UPDATE







Dear Bayport-Blue Point Residents:

All of us at the Bayport-Blue Point Public Library are wishing you well during this challenging period.

In late June, the Library began to open our doors again as we entered "Phase 3" of our step-by-step re-opening process. Until back in full operation, the Library is adhering to a number of modifications: our hours are reduced, we're running at 50-percent occupancy, and we're unable to host group gatherings, workshops, classes, and meetings. We must also restrict some of our seating areas, computer usage, and access to library stacks. And while we began in-person pick-up and returns, we are continuing our contactless curbside service as well.

The Library hopes to be fully open again when state and local authorities deem it to be safe to do so. Meanwhile, please visit our website – or call us – to learn about the specific services now being offered.

Happily, on July 10, we were joined by local dignitaries for a groundbreaking ceremony for our new Library on the site of the former convent of the Sisters of Saint Ursula at 186 Middle Road in Blue Point. If construction proceeds on schedule, we expect to open the doors to our new 28,573-square-foot facility in the fall of 2021.

The Library has been able to commence interior and exterior site renovations at the former convent in the aftermath of awarding five construction grants totaling \$11,279,350 in value. Grant categories include: site, general, mechanical, plumbing, and electrical. Awards went to qualified, Long Island-based contractors who had submitted the most cost-competitive bids.

Finally, thanks to the leadership of Rob Calarco, Presiding Officer of the Suffolk County Legislature, as well as Legislator Anthony Piccirillo, the County has provided the Library with a \$250,000 grant that enables us to build an advanced wastewater treatment system to reduce nitrogen discharges into local groundwater.




The Best-Loved Sing-Along Folk Songs Ever!





Kindness Rocks!!




