Dear Bayport-Blue Point Residents:

On behalf of all of us here at the Bayport-Blue Point Public Library, we hope this message finds you in good health and good spirits.

This has been a difficult period for our community and for our country. We have appreciated your patience and your encouragement as the Library moves forward to reestablish normal operations since our temporary closure on March 15.

Here's the latest on our four-phase re-opening timetable:

Phase 1: Members of our essential staff came back to work. About half of our team returned to the Library on May 26. Phase 1 did not allow us to have public in the building or curbside services.

Phase 2: Beginning with a "soft roll-out' during the week of June 1, we planned and executed operational curbside pickup on Monday, June 8.

Phase 3: At this point, we are hoping to bring the public back into the building on a limited-capacity basis by the end of June or the beginning of July.

Phase 4: Our aim is to steadily re-introduce various services between mid-July and early August as New York
