Petition forms are due: Monday, March 8, 2021 before 5pm. Applicants must obtain petition forms from the Office of the School District Clerk.

Registration

Registration is on-going at the Office of the School District Clerk on any school day between the hours of 9:00 am and 2:00 pm until April 1, 2021.

Qualifications for Voting

Age: 18 and over. Citizen of the U.S. Resident in Bayport-Blue Point School District for at least 30 days. Registered to vote in general or school district elections.

Absentee Ballots

If you are unable to vote in person, you may apply for an absentee ballot at the library during regular hours or at the Office of the School District Clerk on any school day between 9am and 4pm. The School District Clerk must receive the application at least seven (7) days before the election if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or the day before the election if it is to be delivered personally to the voter. The school district clerk must receive absentee ballots not later than 5pm on the day of the vote, April 6. Dear Bayport-Blue Point Residents:

Here is a budget update from the Bayport-Blue Point Public Library, along with three important, upcoming dates.

As many of you recall, local residents voted on December 6, 2018 to support a bond issue to fund the redevelopment of the St. Ursula Center on Middle Road in Blue Point as our community's new library.

We're pleased to report that the transformation of the former convent has been proceeding on time and on budget. It's an exciting process to witness. Library trustees and staff have been working in close cooperation with the architecture and construction teams to help ensure successful completion of the project. Our new library is expected to be open and ready for public use by this fall.

As the redevelopment initiative has advanced, your library board has remained focused on cost control and fiscal prudence in our overall management of our library. We have developed a 2021-2022 budget that reflects our ongoing commitment to fiscal responsibility, something that is much needed in these economically stressful and uncertain times. With this in mind, we worked hard to minimize costs in every possible way. As a result, there will be no increase in the operating budget for the 2021-2022 fiscal year and thus, no budget vote. This would be our third straight year without a budget increase to the operational budget. The only increase this year and the last two years has been and will be for the bond repayment which had been previously approved.

There will be, however, an election for the trustee seat currently held by Mary Ellen Adams. The election for that trustee seat is set for Tuesday, April 6, 2021 from 10:00am to 9:00pm at the library.

To inform the community about the forthcoming budget, we have scheduled a budget information meeting for Wednesday, March 24, 2021 at 7:00pm when you can learn more about the planned budget and meet the candidates running for trustee.
