The Bayport-Blue Point Public Library has set **Saturday, December 18 at 11:00am** for the grand opening of its new facility on the grounds of the former site of the St. Ursula Center at 186 Middle Road in Blue Point. The old library will be closing on December 1 to start the move into the new facility.

The public is invited to the grand opening event, which will include a ribbon-cutting ceremony and tours of the new facility.

As the library prepares to launch its new site – and to allow time to transfer materials from the current to the new location – library services will be limited

to online programs, phone or email reference, and limited availability to pick-up holds and materials from curbside pickup. Patrons requiring in-person library services during this period are encouraged to take advantage of inter-library loan privileges at neighboring libraries such as Patchogue-Medford and Sayville.

"The opening of our new, cutting edge library represents an exciting milestone in the history of the Bayport and Blue Point communities," said Ronald F. Devine, Jr., President of the Bayport-Blue Point Public Library board of trustees. "We invite members of the community at large to join us on December 18."



Winter Warmers with Chef Rob (Virtual) Thursday, December 16, 6:00 pm


Chef Rob will be on the library's Facebook page to show you how to make a Yukon gold potato and leek soup and a winter chocolate snowstorm cookie. No registration required.

The Ursuline sisters purchased the property in 1935 and used their convent as a novitiate, religious training center, and retirement home. The sisters were a positive force in our community for over 80 years. Come travel back in time and explore the fascinating histories that took place on the grounds of our library!
