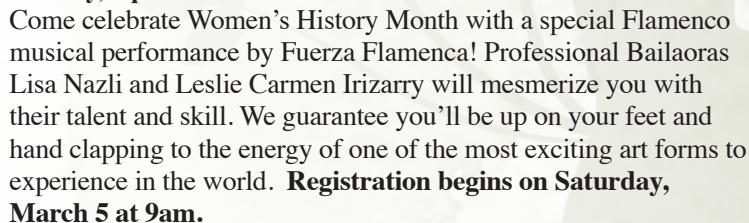
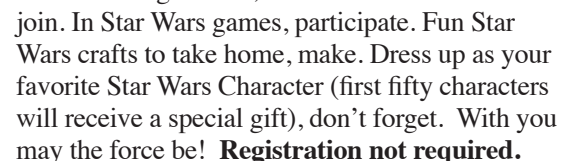

Available in the library or at home from our website, the World Book Online subscription consists of three parts: World Book Online for Kids, World Book Online Student and World Book Online Timelines.

Graphic Novel Club

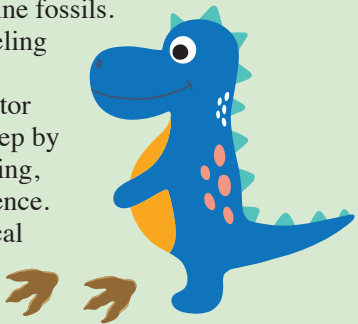

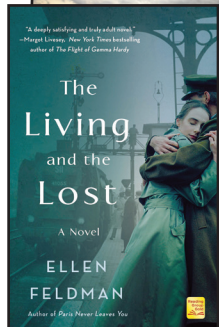
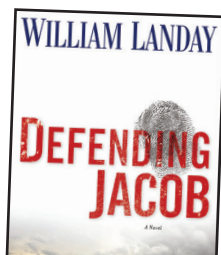


Library Book Club

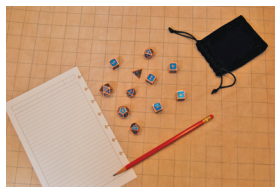

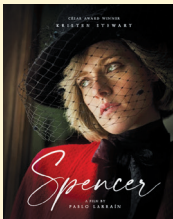

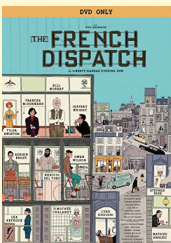
