



There are several registration options: Online, walk in, and call in. Children should be registered for programs with their own library cards. Registration is required for all programs unless stated otherwise. Program registration for non-residents will begin on Saturday, July 6 at 9:00am.

Things to Know About Registering for Programs:

- Unless a program is marked **SERIES**, all program sessions must be registered for individually. For programs marked as a series, you will be registered for all sessions at once.







We will introduce mantras, pranayama (breath control) and basic meditation techniques. Bhakti refers to a spiritual way of being in which we realize we are not the body and not the mind but something divine. Teens will leave class feeling well balanced, grounded and with a new perspective.






The Suffolk County Summer Library Tour Returns!
